


Live Christmas Tree Curbside



# SPRING LEAF COLLECTION – 2 CYCLES:

**The 1ST CYCLE BEGINS MONDAY,  
APRIL 13TH**

**The 2ND FINAL CYCLE BEGINS MONDAY,  
APRIL 27TH**

## THE RULES:

Place your leaves out prior to the start of each cycle – This does not mean that everyone's leaves will be picked up on the first day of collection, it takes the Public Works Department approximately 2 weeks to complete each cycle.

Leaves must be bagged in BIODEGRADABLE BROWN PAPER BAGS or placed in CONTAINERS NO LARGER THAN 32 GALLONS  
NO tree branches, acorns or other debris – LEAVES ONLY

If we come to your street and your leaves were not out on the first collection cycle, we will not be back until the Next Cycle begins.  
After Curbside Collection ends and throughout the year, Residents can bring their leaves into the Recycling Center during normal operating hours.

Residents Please Note: If you are bringing leaves into the Recycling Center in plastic bags you must empty the bags in the leaf pile and take the empty bag(s) with you for disposal at home. If you are bringing leaves in BIODEGRADABLE BROWN PAPER BAGS leave the bag(s) with the leaves in the leaf pile.

You may bring branches from tree trimming and shrubs, place these items loose (not tied) in the brush pile.  
WE DO NOT ACCEPT GARBAGE, GRASS, TREES, TREE STUMPS, GRAVEL, DIRT, WOOD CHIPS OR ANY INVASIVE SHRUBS OR VINES SUCH AS BAMBOO OR POISON IVY IN THE RECYCLING CENTER AT ANY TIME FROM ANYONE. IT IS ILLEGAL DUMPING & SUBJECT TO VIOLATION AND PENALTY.

# LACEY RECREATION

## Gille Park

- Township's largest park spanning 34 acres of recreational area
- Four softball fields and four soccer fields which are home to Lacey Girls Softball, Lacey Soccer and Lacey Lacrosse.
- Athletic field lighting exists on two softball fields.
- Three tennis/pickleball courts with a hitting wall.
- Three volleyball courts and one basketball court
- Skate Park
- 1-Mile walking path spanning the perimeter of the park and an exercise equipment station.
- Tot-lot/playground adjacent to a new covered pavilion and picnic area with new grills and picnic tables (pavilion has power).
- Two restroom facilities within the park area.

## Hebrew Park

- Located off Manchester Avenue / Cedar Avenue in Lanoka Harbor
- Three full-sized soccer fields - Home to Lacey Soccer
- One softball field, basketball court and three pickleball courts (exclusive)
- The rear of the Park has a new pavilion and picnic grove area with tables (pavilion has power).
- Tot-Lot / playground area and exercise equipment stations
- A .62 mile perimeter walking path
- Two restroom facilities
- Athletic field lighting is available on two soccer fields as well as the softball field
- Hosts Summer Recreation Camp

## Huffy Wallis Park

- Located off Parkside Drive
- Lacey Township's oldest park
- The park has one softball field, an upgraded Tot-Lot / playground and one basketball court
- Hosts Summer Recreation Camp

# PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES

Lacey Township is the home of five major parks and eight smaller tot-lots with playground areas and benches. All park, tot-lots and beach facilities are maintained by the Lacey Township Department of Public Works. For your enjoyment please visit as often as you can.

## Bamber Park

- Located off Good Luck Road
- Athletic fields, softball and soccer Fields
- Basketball court and two tennis/pickleball courts
- Tot-lot / playground available
- Picnic area and bathing beach open to public

## Ash Road Park

- Located at the intersection of Basin and Ash Roads in Lanoka Harbor.
- Playground and Tot-Lot

## Cedar Creek Beach

- Located at the west end of Forrest Avenue
- This beach requires beach badges, life guarded
- Restroom facilities are available

## Meadowlark Beach

- Located off Meadowlark Drive
- This is an unguarded Bayfront Beach
- Small playground / Tot-Lot structure.

## Deer Head Lake (3rd Lake)

- Located along Deerhead Lake Drive.
- This lake is the first of three lakes which empties into the Forked River
- Home of numerous recreation events throughout the summer season such as movie nights and concerts
- Excellent location for sunset viewing

## Cedar Lake (1st Lake, Mill Pond)

- Located along Parker Avenue, Forked River
- The lake is not open for swimming
- Excellent fishing , hosts the annual Fishing Derby
- Basketball court
- Parking area provided.

## Enos Pond County Park

- Located at the eastern end of Lacey Road.
- One of the biggest collections of native and rare Pine Barrens plants in the county
- Enos Park is maintained by Ocean County Parks Department
- Playground / Tot-Lot Equipment for ages 2 – 12.
- Restroom facilities, picnic tables, park benches

## Clune Park

- Located off Beach Boulevard / Sandy Hook Drive
- The Park is home for Little League, AYF Football and Lacey Boys Lacrosse
- There are three Little League fields, two, 50/70 fields, one regulation size baseball field and three full-sized football fields that are also utilized for lacrosse play
- The park has two restroom facilities and a Tot-Lot / playground
- Athletic field lighting available on all football fields & on three of the Little League baseball fields
- Hosts Summer Recreation Camp

## Forked River Beach Bay Front Park

- Located at the Eastern End of Beach Boulevard along the Barnegat Bay.
- An observation / overlook platform providing views of the Barnegat Bay and Barnegat Lighthouse
- Two separate Tot-Lots for ages 2 - 5 and 5-12 years - including a handicap access swing
- Large pavilion with benches and picnic tables
- Sixteen separate pieces of exercise equipment
- Over a 1/3 mile walking pathway with views of the Barnegat Bay and benches to rest

## Mezera Park

- Located along Lakeside Drive South.
- Two Tot-Lot / playgrounds for ages 2-5 years and 5-12 years
- Scenic views of Lacey's largest lake, Lake Barnegat

## Lake Barnegat Beach

- Located along the north shoreline of the lake off Lakeside Drive
- Home of the Wibit water attraction
- Beach badges required during the summer season
- Life Guards are available during the summer season
- Restrooms are available at this location.





The mission of the Lacey Township Municipal Alliance Committee is to work with the Police, Schools, Community Groups and businesses to provide community members with quality programs which educate our citizens about drug, alcohol and tobacco abuse and misuse. Part of this mission is also to provide a coordinated approach to advocacy, collaboration and education to promote wellness among all age groups and to keep individuals and families healthy and safe.

### MISSION STATEMENT

The Lacey Township Municipal Alliance Committee is a coalition of citizens from the business, church and school community as well as members of local organizations. Alliance members work together to develop, plan, and implement programs and activities, which will assist in the prevention of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs (ATOD).

The State of New Jersey provides half of the funding for the Alliance through a grant from the Governor's Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse. Lacey Township matches the grant through 25% cash match and 75% as an In-Kind (goods and services) donation.

*Since Covid-19, the funding from DEDR was reduced by nearly 70% and is now funded through different sources from the State. We have been very fortunate to subsidize our programs through the profits from the 5K Race.*

Each year the Alliance awards scholarships in memory of Timothy Santucci, a 1998 Lacey graduate who died in February 2003. He dedicated himself to excellence in both academics and sports while living substance-free. Tim also was the DJ for many of our Prom Breakfast and Project Graduation activities. The Scholarship Committee places a heavy emphasis on community involvement during the selection process. The scholarships are not funded through the grant but rather from fund-raising activities such as our 5K Race. ## **SENIOR CONNECTIONS**

Our senior programs continue to be very popular. Our goal is to encourage seniors to stay active and "connected" in the community. Studies have shown that socially active people are healthier as they age. The Alliance offers a variety of activities from exercise classes and luncheons, to our intergenerational programs.

The Alliance continues to offer monthly luncheons and a weekly exercise program to engage seniors. In addition, we offered the Wellness Initiative for Senior Education (W.I.S.E) program in 2025. Seniors met once a week for 6 weeks to explore how life choices and behaviors can have a significant impact on our quality of life. Participants gave excellent reviews of the program. Each session was 1.5 to 2 hours and included lunch.

The Health Ease exercise program 'Move Today' has become extremely popular on Thursday mornings at the new Community Center. From 9:00 to 10:00 am, Certified Trainers **Joan Topping** and **Barbara Racz**, lead seniors in exercises to help improve balance and flexibility as well as muscle strengthening. These sessions run all year except for part of the summer, and are safe for all seniors.

Line Dancing classes are another form of exercise while also having fun! They take place on Monday mornings at Community Hall from 11:00 am - 12:00

Noon and anyone can join us. No experience necessary! The Drop-In fee is \$3 per class.

Volunteer instructors **Marianne Orlasky** and **Marie Meyer** are still leading our classes. We began hosting a Senior Health Fair in 2023 on the first Friday in October at which seniors can speak to various representatives of health agencies as well as receiving their annual flu shots and a lite lunch.

We have been sponsoring our senior luncheons at the Community Center for 19 years! They provide an opportunity for nearly 80 seniors to come together and socialize. Each luncheon is centered around a theme and would not be possible without our staff of 15+ volunteers that help set up, decorate and clean up each month. Attendees are served a complete meal under the guidance of **Sharon Hoffman**, **Chris Brown** and **Barbara Racz**. Ice Cream for dessert is provided by Spring Oak Assisted Living and served with cookies from "**John the Cookie Man**". The luncheons are a wonderful way to get out, share some laughs and meet new friends. We do however, insist on calling ahead to make a reservation so we can accurately plan our meals. If you are a Lacey senior, or know someone who would benefit from this program, please let us know. Transportation is available through the Recreation Department if necessary, however, arrangements must be made in advance.

## Task Force

The Task Force worked in conjunction with the Lacey Township School District to put together a Health and Wellness Night featuring the “Healthy Choices Variety Show” in April at the High School. This was an evening which included resource tables in the cafeteria with pizza, provided by LTEA, and Tom and Dee’s Italian Ice provided for refreshments. Breakout activities which were approximately 20 minutes in length, making Vision Boards, Cupcake Decorating and Charcuterie Making sessions proving to be quite popular. Art projects were also on display in the hallways. The evening concluded with the “Healthy Choices Variety Show” which featured video PSAs produced by students of Jeremy Muermann’s Media Production classes in addition to a poetry slam, a vocal and ukulele performance, with the closing number provided by the High School Jazz Band. A broad section of the community attended the event, from teenagers through senior citizens.

In 2012 the Task Force was created in response to the increasing number of drug overdoses in our community. We knew that every effort was needed to shine the light on this issue and to dispel some misconceptions about who was using and abusing drugs. Our focus has been to raise awareness and develop strategies to prevent the use and misuse of alcohol and other substances. We will continue those efforts in the Spring of 2026 with another “Healthy Choices” program.

## MESSAGE FROM THE COORDINATOR

Our mission is to promote wellness among all age groups and to keep individuals and families healthy and safe. As parents, many of us have expressed frustration by wondering why our children make bad decisions when we tell them over and over again not to. We try to warn them to avoid risky behaviors such as speeding when they’re behind the wheel of a car or getting high. The explanation is really quite simple. The frontal lobe portion of the brain is responsible for decision making, however it is not fully developed until the age of 25. Therefore, the teenage brain does not connect the negative consequences of not controlling their impulsive behavior. Any substance use also compounds this behavior because it literally hijacks the frontal lobe where decision-making and evaluating consequences are processed. The same is true of social media, also considered an addiction, especially in our youth.

It's vital to establish open lines of communication with your child, listening to them and showing them that you care. Parents can also support good brain health in their children by providing good nutrition and encouraging better sleep habits. We urge all parents to keep abreast of the ever-evolving ways their pre-teens and teens use social media and its negative effects. Social media is also considered an addiction. It's well documented that stress and anxiety take their toll on our emotional and physical well-being and increase the likelihood of substance use at an early age. For our youth, this can lead to using alcohol and other drugs as a way of coping.

We're also concerned that the legalization of recreational marijuana sends a message to our youth that it's okay to smoke weed. Studies show that early first use contributes to social, academic and behavioral problems resulting in long-term consequences. The only messaging that marijuana is safe is proclaimed and disseminated by those who stand to profit from the production and sales of it. Throughout history, companies have targeted their advertising towards our youth; this continues to be the case with the marijuana industry and the marketing of edibles. We fervently ask that you speak to your children about the risks of using marijuana as well as alcohol and other illegal substances.

There are many opportunities for people to become involved in the Alliance. Whether it is working on existing programs or helping to develop new approaches to achieve our mission, we welcome your input. Some volunteers are not official members but rather help out on occasion. If you would like to join us in our quest to make our community a safer environment, please join us. We welcome input from the community. Our Alliance meetings take place on the 4th Monday of the month downstairs in the Municipal Building at 7:00pm except in May and December. Anyone is invited to attend.



Place your their leaves out prior to the start of each cycle – This does not mean that everyone's leaves will be picked up on the first day of collection, it takes the Public Works Department approximately 2 weeks to complete each cycle.

Leaves must be bagged in BIODEGRADABLE BROWN PAPER BAGS or placed in CONTAINERS NO LARGER THAN 32 GALLONS  
NO tree branches, acorns or other debris – LEAVES ONLY

If we come to your street and your leaves were not out on the first collection cycle, we will not be back until the Next Cycle begins  
After Curbside Collection ends and throughout the year, Residents can bring their leaves into the Recycling Center during normal operating hours.

Residents Please Note: If you are bringing leaves into the Recycling Center in plastic bags you must empty the bags in the leaf pile and take the empty bag(s) with you for disposal at home. If you are bringing leaves in BIODEGRADABLE BROWN PAPER BAGS leave the bag(s) with the leaves in the leaf pile.

You may bring branches from tree trimming and shrubs, to the Recycling Center place these items loose (not tied) in the brush pile.  
WE DO NOT ACCEPT GARBAGE, GRASS, TREES, TREE STUMPS, GRAVEL, DIRT, WOOD CHIPS OR ANY INVASIVE SHRUBS OR VINES SUCH AS BAMBOO OR POISON IVY IN THE RECYCLING CENTER AT ANY TIME FROM ANYONE. IT IS ILLEGAL DUMPING & SUBJECT TO VIOLATION AND PENALTY.



# SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AT CURBSIDE

Solid Waste Collection provided by Meadowbrook Industries (609) 971-7979

## Chapter 289 of the Township Code of the Township of Lacey

**PREPARATION** All garbage and rubbish containing food waste shall be kept in leak-proof, commercially available containers with tight-fitting lids or covers and shall be kept covered at all times, unless the contents of same are being removed or contents are being placed therein. Plastic bags or any receptacle which does not fit the above description shall not be used for garbage and rubbish containing food waste; and if so used, garbage and rubbish container therein shall not be collected.

**CONTAINER SIZE** 32 gallon container with a lid and serviceable handles. Containers may not be more than 32 gallons in size due to the fact that garbage collection is done manually. **TRASH CONTAINER SHOULD BE A DIFFERENT COLOR THAN YOUR RECYCLING CONTAINER. WE HAVE DECALS LOCATED AT LACEY TOWNSHIP PUBLIC WORKS OFFICE.**

**COLLECTION** Containers must be placed at curbside or adjacent to the road if no curbs exists, in a place which is visible and easily accessible for collectors, either the night before or by 6:00 am on the day of collection and removed within 24 hours after collection. The contractor is not required to come back and pick up your garbage if it is set out late and the truck has already passed through your area.

### Solid Waste Services include the following:

**FURNITURE AND BEDDING** Residents are allowed to dispose of 2 furniture pieces per week on regular collection days, preferably the second collection day, as the first collection days are usually very heavy, especially in the spring and summer months. Mattresses and box springs can be put out for collection, provided it is not raining. If it is raining or there is a chance of rain, please cover the mattresses and box springs in plastic

**CARPET** Approximately 1 room per week (20 rolls max), preferably on your second collection day. Carpet must be tied and bundled no more than 4' in length weighing no more than 50 lbs. per bundle. Cover in plastic if it is raining or if rain is expected.

**LUMBER** Scrap lumber pieces can be tied and bundled no more than 4' in length, weighing no more than 50 lbs. per bundle. (2-3 bundles max) If pieces are small enough, you can put them in your trash can.

**The following items WILL NOT BE COLLECTED at all, it is up to Residents to properly dispose of these items, call the Public Works Department for information prior to setting them out at curbside.**

- House clean-outs
- Building and construction materials, fixtures, windows, etc, resulting from major alterations and renovations to properties by owners or contractor's, especially those that required a Building or Demolition Permit
- Concrete, brick, asphalt, asbestos
- Roofing shingles
- Tires and auto batteries
- Paint, motor oil or antifreeze

**RESPONSIBILITY** If your garbage has spilled over and onto the street prior to collection, it is your responsibility to clean it up. The contractor is not responsible for cleaning up garbage that has blown over and spilled onto the street or placed out in plastic bags and torn open by animals.

**VIOLATION** Any container that does not comply with the above specifications or creates a hazard or danger to the collectors shall be affixed with a red tag. In the event that a container is affixed with a red tag, it shall be a violation to utilize that container for future disposal of garbage, refuse and other rubbish.



**WALL BOARD/PLASTER BOARD** Only 3 cans or bundles per month weighing no more than 50 lbs. per bundle.


**SLIDING GLASS DOORS, TEMPERED GLASS TABLES, MIRRORS** Tape up the glass and wrap the entire surface in a heavy duty tarp or blanket, label it GLASS. It will get picked up with regular garbage on your second collection day.

**TOILETS** Separate the tank from the bowl. It will get picked up with regular garbage on your second collection day.

**APPLIANCES, METAL ITEMS, LAWN MOWERS, AC UNITS, BASKETBALL HOOPS, BBQ GRILLS, LARGE TVs** Picked up weekly. Please call the Public Works Dept. to schedule a pick up of any of these items. 609-693-1100, ext. 2301

- Propane tanks
- Trees, earth, root matter, stones and leaves
- Household Hazardous Waste including pool chemicals and fertilizers
- Mandated Recyclables – please refer to Curbside Recycling Collection and/or Recycling Center information
- Electronics including Televisions
- Wood Pallets

It's impossible to list everything. When in doubt, call the Public Works Department first, this will save you time and a visit from the Code Enforcement Officer.

**PREPARATION** All mandated single stream recyclable items must be loose in cans. No bundles or plastic bags.

**CONTAINER SIZE** 32 gallon containers with a lid and serviceable handles. Containers may not be more than 32 gallons in size due to the fact that recycling collection is done manually. **RECYCLING CONTAINER SHOULD BE A DIFFERENT COLOR THAN YOUR TRASH CONTAINER. WE RECOMMEND A BLUE CONTAINER FOR RECYCLING. WE HAVE DECALS LOCATED AT THE LACEY TOWNSHIP PUBLIC WORKS OFFICE.**

**COLLECTION** Containers must be placed at curbside or adjacent to the road if no curbs exist, in a place which is visible and easily accessible for collectors, either the night before or by 6:00 am on the day of collection and removed within 24 hours after collection. The contractor is not required to come back and pick up your recycling if it is set out late and the

truck has already passed through your area.

**RESPONSIBILITY** If your recycling has spilled over and onto the street prior to collection, it is your responsibility to clean it up. The contractor is not responsible for cleaning up recycling that has blown over and spilled onto the street or placed out in a plastic bag.

**VIOLATION** Any container that does not comply with above specifications or creates a hazard or danger to collectors shall be affixed with a red tag. In the event that a container is affixed with a red tag, it shall be a violation to utilize that container for future disposal of recycling, garbage, refuse & other rubbish.




